The story of God's people, being led by Moses, through the wilderness has always been one of my favorites. There is so much to learn about trusting God in the wilderness from their story. The Israelites grew impatient with their circumstances.

They tired of the journey, the food, and water, struggle and discomfort. They became rebellious and ungrateful. They fell into grumbling, murmuring, and complaining against God. The story goes on to show God's grace, mercy and love as he continues to provide for his people. What occurs to me is how much like these people I am.

My family and I have been on a journey since the first of January. We have been in the wilderness of pain and suffering. Unfair and unjust circumstances have come into our lives and on top of that I came down with pneumonia. I found myself doubting God's justice, angry that these things were happening to us, struggling to hold onto my trust in God's desire to provide and protect us. I began to mumble, mummer and complain.

But, little by little I began to see God's hand of provision. Little by little I started to see Christ with us. Where did we see Christ? How did He provide for us? Through all of you.

We saw Him in the eyes of those who made soup, cupcakes and cookies for me while I was sick. We saw him in the eyes of those who sent and delivered a prayer shawl and flowers. We experienced His love in every note, card and letter that was written to us and for us. We felt the love of Christ in every hug, and heard His voice in every word of support and kindness. We moved forward supported by your prayers. I don't want to name any names because I am afraid I will miss someone and I hold all of you in my heart.

The journey continues for us. Like the Israelites, we don't know how it will end. We only know that it will and that God is with us every step of the way.

Our deepest heart felt thank you to all of you. My family and I are blessed by your love and forever grateful for all you have done for us. Please continue to hold us in your prayers as we journey through the wilderness together.

Share Easter Joy with Children:

- On Good Friday, walk around all day with a pebble in your shoe. Then talk about that burden and what Jesus' suffering means to you.
- Make an Easter Cross Garden use wooden paint-stirring sticks and a hot glue gun to help children make crosses.
 With permanent marker, write on each cross what it means to kids that Jesus is alive. Then display the crosses in a flower garden on Easter morning.
- Did you know? Easter is the oldest Christian holiday and the most important day of the church year! It's a "moveable feast", meaning the date changes. Since the year 325, Easter has been on the first Sunday after the full moon following the northern hemisphere's vernal (spring) equinox.
