

TEN COMMANDMENTS

Commandments, we've learned some interesting – and important – things about these laws from God.

- We've learned that the commandments were given to us as a gift, because God loves us.
- The commandments are given to us as a guide for life. When we follow what God teaches, our lives go better. Some of us have experienced the troubles that come when we don't do it God's way, and many of us have witnessed the blessings of a good life lived in obedience to God.
- None of us has a completely clean slate, in obeying these commandments. We are all sinners. Some of our violations of God's will are clear and obvious, like skipping worship or using God's name as a swear word. There are other violations that you may not be aware of, unless you are a good student of the Bible. Speaking evil or angry words to another person is the same as murder, Jesus teaches and we've probably all done that. Looking at another person with lust is the same as adultery, Jesus teaches; that certainly makes that particular commandment more wide-reaching! We are all sinners.

Jesus forgives sin! One of the purposes of the ten commandments is to make us aware of our own sinfulness, and to drive us into the arms of Jesus seeking his gracious gift of forgiveness. We are sinners who would suffer the punishment for our sins – except that Jesus loves us so much that he took the punishment (death!) onto himself, to set us free. The commandments send us looking for a Savior, and we find our Savior in Jesus Christ.



Missionary We are currently a little over halfway through our time in the U.S. this summer on missionary home assignment. So far we have visited a total of 11 churches out of our total of about 24 sponsoring congregations, and we look forward to visiting three more in the coming weeks. Unfortunately, of course, we can't visit all of our sponsoring congregations every two years when we have our home assignment, so we have chosen only the ones we did not visit two years ago. We will also be spending a week at the ELCA Summer Missionary Conference at Carthage College in Kenosha, Wisconsin. Except for a car problem in Oklahoma, all has gone well. It has been great to see previous acquaintances and make new ones. For the last few weeks, we have been staying with our daughter Elizabeth and her husband Matt in Columbus, Ohio, so that has been enjoyable as well.

Leaving Mexico was kind of hectic, since we actually had to leave for the U.S. on the same day that our semester at the Theological Community of Mexico was ending, so there was a lot to do. And plans are for classes there to start the day after I return to Mexico from the last congregational visit scheduled (Alicia has to head back to Mexico about 10 days before I do because her school begins classes earlier than we do at the Theological Community). So our schedule has been quite tight.

Because we have been here in the U.S., there is not a lot of news from Mexico to share with you for this newsletter. However, I have updated a number of things on my website about our visits, and I have also uploaded some videos that can be seen on You Tube. See my site at:

One of the videos I uploaded to YouTube is in memory of Ben Larson, the ELCA Seminarian who died in the earthquake in January in Haiti while doing mission service there. A few weeks after that happened, I shared the story with our Lutheran professors and students. Abel Gutierrez, a Lutheran student in our music program at the Theological Community, sings in a Christian hip-hop music group with his cousin, Marcos Morales, and when Abel shared Ben's story with Marcos, Marcos was so touched that he downloaded one of Ben Larson's songs (sung partly in Spanish) and some photos of Ben, and used these to make a 5-minute video. All have been very touched and inspired both by the video and the witness that Ben left. So if you get a chance, you can go to my website and click on the link to the video.

We will be in touch with you again when we return to Mexico. In the meantime, we send you our greetings and pray that all is going well with your ministries.


