Words have power!

What we call things, how we describe persons and events, and the way we label issues in our lives have the power to shape our perspectives. We have heard or read bias regarding a political candidate or issue in the

media. Sometimes it is blatant, more often it is subtle and long term.

I am sorry to say, I have seen just such an issue in the way we describe money here at Grace. We have for generations talked about what we put in the offering plate here as "subscriptions". Back in the 40's to subscribe to something was to give assent and support. Today it sounds like we are selling magazines! Someone the other day called and asked when they could make their "payment". I think I know what they meant and I applaud their desire to give. Yet it sounded like we had a mortgage on the person's soul and they were afraid of God's repossession!

In a dozen other ways we have used words here which may once have meant what we wanted to say but now do not. Let me suggest changing our language to a few words which are Biblical and much clearer in today's way of speaking.

First of all, what we do with what God has first granted us the use of is called "stewardship". This involves EVERYTHING in our lives. Time, abilities, and resources. It is not about "give God 10% and do whatever YOU want with the rest". No, God in our Baptism has a claim on our entire lives. How we organize and use what God has

placed in our care, everything God has placed in our care, is an example of how we give thanks to God and try to do His will.

Another word to look at is "offerings". We offer to God, "what He has first given us" as a way of saying thank you to God and also as a reflection of our recognition of God's sovereignty over our lives. God is God. He deserves our worship, praise, and service for that reason alone! Thus we "offer" ourselves back to God with the time, ability, and yes, the resources he has placed in our care.

And third I want to look at the word "benevolence". In 2011 we gave a bit over \$33,000 to causes and groups outside the four walls of Grace. That represents about 8% of our total offerings. I wonder if we could not be more generous than that?

In the weeks and months ahead you will be hearing more from the Stewardship committee of the congregation working in conjunction with the Executive committee and others in an effort to re-examine and renew the way we live together here. It is a good thing to do periodically. When a new pastor arrives, you will receive her or his input. As the interim pastor the best thing I can do is hold a mirror up to the face of the congregation and ask us all to look at the reflection and see if there are not ways to do things better. Using words that mean what we say sounds like a good start.



From Our Missionary

December 2011 Dear Friends,

As is the case every year, this past year 2011 has been a time of blessings, growth, and new challenges. Above all, we thank God for continued good health for all the members of our family and for providing us with all that is necessary to work and study. Our daughter, Elizabeth, and her husband Matt, made the biggest move of the year, leaving Columbus, Ohio in August for Elizabeth to begin a PhD program in Statistics Education at the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis. Matt's company in Columbus has allowed him to continue his engineering job and work from their home in Minneapolis. Our daughter, Monica Julie, finished her sophomore year at Augsburg College in May, and her return there for the Fall Semester meant that she was now just down the road from her sister, which was wonderful for both. Up through Alicia continued to teach throughout the year. September, this involved part-time English teaching in a high school program. This also allowed her to spend more time helping to take care of her mother, who turned 96 in June. In September, she accepted a full-time position teaching firstgrade in English at an elementary school.
