# Matthew 28:18-20

"And Jesus came up and spoke to them saying, 'All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth.' And He said to them, 'Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation. ...and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you: He who has believed and has been baptized shall be saved; but He who has disbelieved shall be condemned. Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and rise again from the dead the third day; and that repentance for the forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in His name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem."

My favorite Scripture verse in the entire Bible is "19Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. 

# Soles4Souls - Changing The World One Pair at a Time



During the Lenten season, February 20 – March 20, Grace Lutheran Church, Christian Missions Committee is sponsoring a Soles4Souls Campaign.

Soles4Souls is a Nashville-based charity that collects shoes from the warehouses of footwear companies and the closets of people

like you. Soles4Soles distributes these shoes to people in need, regardless of race, religion, class, or any other criteria. Since 2005, Soles4Souls has delivered over 19 million pairs of new and gently worn shoes. The shoes have been distributed to people in over 125 countries, including Kenya, Thailand, Nepal and the United States.

You can help by donating some of the 700 MILLION pairs of shoes thrown away by Americans each year. We will be accepting your 'extra' pairs of shoes. There will be collection boxes at each entrance to the worship space. Please rubber band your extra pair of shoes and drop them in the collection box.

What types of shoes do you accept? Soles 4 Souls accepts all types of shoes: athletic, running, dress, sandals, pumps, heels, work boots, cleats, dance, flip flops, just as long as they are new or gently worn.

**Do you take half pairs?** Yes, we accept half pairs. Hopefully, we can match them up one day.

What do you do with the shoes you receive? All shoes are processed and graded either by our staff in Wadley, Alabama or by Village Northwest Unlimited, a nonprofit training facility for people with disabilities located in Sheldon, Iowa. New and high grade used shoes are earmarked for crisis relief distribution in the United States or abroad. Lower grade used shoes and shoes inappropriate for crisis relief (e.g. high heeled shoes) are provided to microenterprise programs in developing countries such as Haiti, Tanzania, and Honduras. Shoes that cannot be used are recycled into clean energy at an energy-from-waste facility in Huntsville, Alabama.


