



VOLUNTEERS JOIN FORCES TO AID FREMONT HOMEOWNERS AND NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS

On Saturday, April 27, more than 250 volunteers from 11 Fremont Christian churches joined forces to respond to their neighbors' needs in a semi-annual event called "Love Your Neighbor Day."

One team of volunteers performed a deep cleaning at Share and Care, a nonprofit organization providing low-cost and free clothing and household items as well as other charitable services to those in need. Other volunteers, wearing distinctive yellow t-shirts, spread out in teams to shampoo carpets and clean toys at Village House and organize rooms at Pontifex. A larger crew spent the morning clearing branches and brush and mowing at Misty Meadows Campfire Camp. New this spring, a group of 20 volunteers visited three nursing homes to assist residents in craft projects, bingo games and fellowship.

In addition, approximately 50 homeowners received assistance with home maintenance, upkeep and yard work projects. One homeowner felt "overwhelmed with happiness and thankfulness" while four men "pampered my lawn....The sound of those mowers was music to my ears!" Many homeowners who needed extra assistance appreciated having their windows washed, their gutters cleaned out, walls washed and painted.

Following the morning of service, volunteers gathered for a potluck lunch provided by Jimmy G's Barbecue and various members from the participating churches. Reminiscent of Jesus' feeding of the 5000, the tables really did overflow with an abundance of food, with the excess delivered to Liberty Center Homeless Shelter.

Love Your Neighbor Day grew out of discussions among a consortium of the five Lutheran churches in Fremont (St. John's, St. Mark, Trinity, Faith and Grace) about how to respond to community needs. The first Love Your Neighbor Day occurred in October 2011. Since then, volunteers from Hayes Memorial United Methodist Church, Journey Church, Fremont Church of the Nazarene, New Hope Vineyard, First Brethren, First Presbyterian and Spanish Church of God have also joined this community outreach project, under the auspices of the Fremont Ministry Association. Thrivent Financial, Jimmy G's and Kroger also provided financial and in-kind support.

Volunteers say that they are engaged in this work as a way of paying forward the blessings of God in their own lives. Coordinator Katy Ross explained, "We don't have to travel overseas to be involved in God's mission work. Participants in Love Your Neighbor Day experience the joy of working together as the Body of Christ while sharing their God-given talents for the benefit of others right here in Fremont." The next Love Your Neighbor Day is planned for Saturday, September 28, 2013.
