After 28 years of being a parish pastor there are very few times when I am asked to do something that I have never done before. Yet a couple of weeks ago, I spent a

delightful afternoon doing just that! Let me explain.

In every congregation I have ever served, the students at confirmation time have selected their own Bible verse. Often it has been a bit of a struggle to get a middle schooler to dig into the scriptures and more than once I have had three or more students pick the words, "The Lord is my Shepherd." Thus I was preparing for the annual ordeal. Imagine my surprise when I discovered for the first time in my ministry, I got to select the verses.

At first it seemed daunting. What segment of the word of God should be read for each of these students of whom I have come to be so fond of? In 1966 my pastor selected Psalm 119:105 for me. "Your word is a lamp unto my feet and a light unto my path." I wonder if he knew how that verse would in fact go before me for my life?

So for four hours or so, I sat with my Bible, a concordance, and a vision of each student and in prayer made my selections. Some have warm humor. Others are meant to be held as inspirational. And some just felt right as they came to me in prayer.

I hope each student appreciates the prayer and the "love" that went into the selections. I hope I get a chance to do this again. It was a delight!
