Total funds available for Capital Campaign: \$449,848; Total pledges over 5 years: \$190,750; Pledges received to date: \$38,275; Pledges yet to be received: \$152,475; Funds available plus total pledges outstanding: \$602,323. This is \$100,000 to \$150,000 short of the campaign goal. Motion by Bob Zilles, second by Jeff Koebel to move forward with installation of heating system in Spring, 2009. Need contract, congregational vote for alternate financing.

* Christian Missions - Nothing for council action. Sending \$100 donation out of committee budget for Heartbeat to purchase Bibles for their clients. Becky Seibert is going to Tanzania in August.

* Christian Worship - Nothing for council action. Finalized usher instructions (one page of instructions for each service). Place laminated copy of instructions in a specified spot.

Presented acolyte gifts to senior acolytes on June 1.

* Christian Property - Not doing chicken barbeque this year.

Recommend no food in sanctuary. Motion to reject recommendation by Pastor Paul, second by Jeff Koebel, approved. Property Insurance premium due on July 2 to Church Mutual. Bid by Lutheran Trust \$1500 less than Church Mutual. New appraised value \$9,880,000 by Lutheran Trust, current value \$8,500,000 by Church Mutual. Premium paid quarterly, also covers van.

Ceiling tile removal could start on July 1 with asbestos removal to start on July 21 if approved to go ahead with heating system in 2009.

\$1,550 was the cost for flowers, received \$645. Glass in door of Sunday School room across from office was broken. Replace with plexiglass.

FINANCIAL REPORT

General Fund

The above numbers show that we are making every effort to be financially responsible in our decision making to stay within our budget. Spending is 8% below what we expected our expenses would be for the year.

However, as shown below, giving is not keeping up with our actual expenses and we have taken in \$23,155.57 less than we have spent. A contributing factor to this is our Natural Gas bill with year to date expenses of \$26,458.48. The gas bill will continue to have less impact as the warmer months approach.

Back to the Wild!**



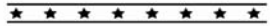

Back to the Wild is a wildlife rehabilitation & nature education center located in Castalia, Ohio. It is one of a few centers in Ohio, both federally and state licensed, to accept injured and orphaned wildlife for the purpose of rehabilitation and release back into the wild. The center treats over 2,500 wild animals yearly, including hawks, owls, eagles, deer, fox, rabbits, squirrels, songbirds, herons, waterfowl reptiles, and amphibians. Back to the Wild is committed to teaching future generations the great need to "preserve and protect" our natural world. Anyone wishing to donate "Wish List" items to the center, can contact John Walker, 419-355-0017, and he will pick up and deliver to the center. June 8, 2008

After being in Spain for 3 weeks, and out of touch completely for 1 week, Michael called today from Djibouti. He made it back safely, with enough time to unpack, do laundry and paperwork, repack and head out on the 10th.

He thanks everyone who sent birthday cards for his 40th birthday and is so grateful for the thoughts, prayers, & wishes. Many thanks also for the boxes of food and supplies that continue to arrive for him and his team. Because of the rebel fighting in Djibouti, his team continues to be on lockdown. Some of them have been able to take their 2-week leaves, others are trying to do what they can locally, since they are not allowed to go into their mission areas yet. Michael and Major Canada (yep, that's his name, but it was funnier before he got promoted, he was "Captain" Canada) will head out on the 10th for 3 weeks somewhere in Kenya. He can't be more specific other than to say they will be in a "rough neighborhood".

He told me that Red Cross, CARE, and other aid agencies have all been kicked out of this area because the local "leader" believes they support his opponents; most recently, a religious leader was brutally murdered. Michael is not happy about this mission, and I ask all of you to keep him close in your prayers. He is searching for meaning in this country, where he sees children starving everyday, and he tells me again, he is a "napkin on a flood". He is homesick, tired, and sometimes feels like he can never do enough. You all have been unbelievably kind with your words, your thoughts, your prayers, and your gifts to us. I cannot imagine going through this deployment without the love and support of our family, friends, and church. Thank you from my heart!

I will update you again, hopefully with more encouraging news. I have confidence that your prayers will do what is needed! They always have.

Mark Dever invites you into the conversation on why evangelism is often unpracticed. This book seeks to help you practice sharing your faith from a practical perspective.

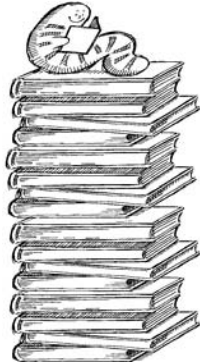
Deadly Viper: Character Assassins



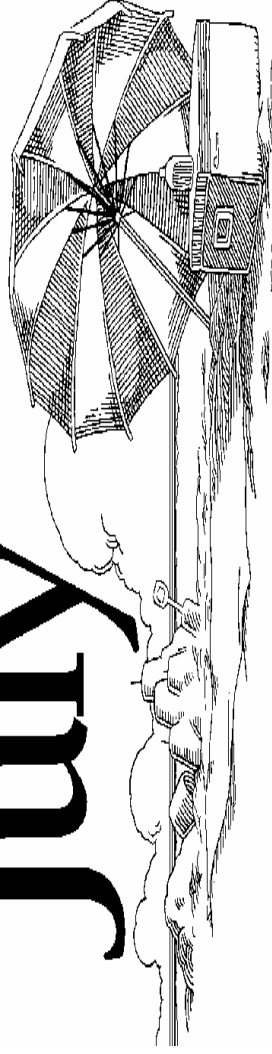
