The above numbers show that we are making every effort to be financially responsible in our decision making to stay within our budget. Spending is 10% below what we expected our expenses would be.

However, as shown below, giving is not keeping up with our actual expenses and we have taken in \$17,620.86 less than we have spent. A contributing factor to this is our Natural Gas bill with year to date expenses of \$22,059.24. The gas bill should begin to drop as the warmer months approach.

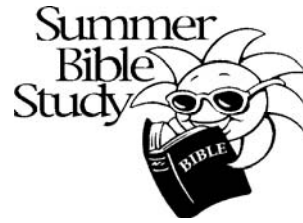

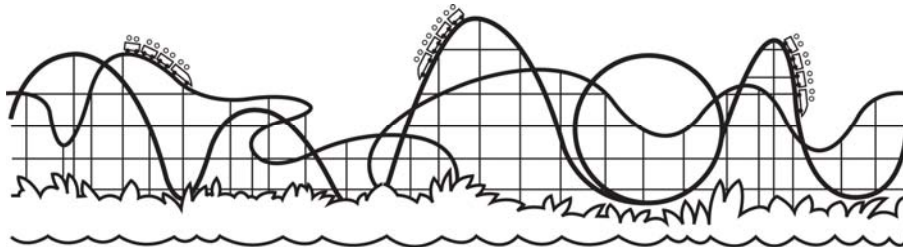
