As I continue to read through the Bible in 90 Days, I have discovered it to be a joy and blessing – and challenge, sometimes! We've just passed the halfway mark, which means that I recently read the entire book of Psalms. And I was struck – again – by how important worship has always been, for the people of God.

Here is an entire book of the Bible devoted to worship songs: 150 of them in this book, and other psalms of worship scattered in other books of the Bible. There are songs of praise, and songs of sorrow. There are short songs, long songs, happy songs, sad songs – very much like the way we worship today.

So let's think about how the psalms of old shape our worship today. For starters, one of the offering songs we sing is taken straight from Psalm 51:

Create in me a clean heart, O God, And put a new and right spirit within me.

In just a few days, our congregation will celebrate the festival of Reformation, and we will sing that great Lutheran anthem, "A Mighty Fortress is our God". Martin Luther wrote the words of this hymn, and he based it on Psalm 46:

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Because of translation, perhaps we don't recognize a direct connection between hymn and psalm, but we know from Luther's writing that Psalm 46 was his inspiration.

Then we will come to November 1, All Saints Day, which this year falls directly on a Sunday. On that day, the words from Psalm 34 might be on our minds:

O fear the Lord, you his saints, For those who fear him have no want. Not too far down the road after that, we come to Thanksgiving. And we will be reminded of this theme, which is found in Psalm 106 and several others.

O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, For his steadfast love endures forever.

So as we gather together for worship, in these days of October and November, let's remember that we are gathering with the saints of old, surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses. Let us sing our praise to God with boldness. The psalms are not just words on a page; they are the living faith of God's people before us, who have passed their faith through the generations and now to us. Thanks be to God!

From Our

For this newsletter, I'd like to share a little bit about a significant development at the Theological Community, which is undergoing a restructuring process. The Theological Community has always been a consortium of member seminaries, but now will be incorporating a couple of other members, one of which is AMEXTRA, the Mexican Association for Rural and Urban Transformation. AMEXTRA has historic ties with the Lutheran Church here in Mexico and has worked for years with the ELCA. This year AMEXTRA celebrated its 25th anniversary. During these years it has been Missionary involved in community development projects in both rural and urban settings, working in areas such as health and edu-

cation programs, emergency relief, income generation, and care for the environment. The emphasis throughout is on holistic transformation. I would encourage you to look at AMEXTRA's web site, www.amextra.org.

I find it interesting that AMEXTRA, in its holistic transformation work, feels the need to strengthen its biblical and theological base, while the Theological Community looks to relate Christian theology more with practical aspects of social transformation. The two must go hand-in-hand. If transformation is truly to be holistic, it must of course take into account the spiritual aspect, as AMEXTRA recognizes. From AMEXTRA's perspective, church leaders need to have a vision that is biblically-grounded and theologically sound if they are to be effective in helping to transform communities. Problems such as poverty, injustice, violence, discrimination, and inequity can only be adequately addressed when we realize that these are rooted in theological worldviews that must be questioned and challenged. The reality in which people live cannot be transformed without transforming the way they see themselves, other people, their communities, and the world around them, and this is a theological task. From the perspective of the Theological Community, any leadership training that divorces theology from the work of transforming communities, society, and the world at large must be regarded as inadequate and unfaithful to God's Word.

Finally, Alicia and I would like to thank all of you who sponsor us for your continuing support, which means a great deal to us. For those of you who have not yet renewed your covenant with ELCA Global Mission, we hope you will consider doing so soon. It is a real joy to have the privilege of serving in God's mission here in Mexico, and we look forward to keeping in touch with you in the coming months.

Children's Thanksgiving Recipe

Apple Crumble

Ingredients

- -5 apples
- -1cup rolled oats
- -2/3 cup brown sugar
- -1/2 cup all-purpose flour
- -6 tbsp. butter
- -1 tsp. cinnamon
- -1/4 tsp. salt
- -1/4 tsp. allspice
- -2 tbsp. apple juice or orange juice
- 1. Preheat the oven to 375°. Lightly butter a 9-inch square baking pan, then dust it with flour. Peel, core, and slice the apples, arrange them in the pan.
- 2.In the bowl of an electric mixer, blend the oats, brown sugar, flour, butter, cinnamon, salt and allspice on low speed until it forms a coarse meal. Crumble the mixture evenly over the apple slices and sprinkle with the juice. Bake for 35 min. Makes 6 servings
