A year begins, a year ends. We are now well into the Sunday School/Catechism instruction program year. That goes well. I have come to truly look forward to the questions and insights of our Genesis Bible Study in Adult Sunday School down in the dining area. If you have not been a part of

the study, let me invite you to join us. There have been insights, learnings, and even some healthy disagreements. It has been an exciting study and there is always room for more folks.

The Catechism group is delightful and despite making Wednesday a loooong day for kids and teachers alike, the young folks in this congregation are a special group. One of the young men was listening to my explanation of the preface of the First Commandment, "I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of slavery, out of the house of bondage..." and suggested that could be a preface for **each** of the Ten Commandments not just the first. What a marvelous insight! I am blessed to be a part of that class.

But as the school year gets well and rolling, the "Church" year nears its end. The liturgical season runs from the First Sunday in Advent and ends with Christ the King Sunday. This year that falls on November 20<sup>th</sup>. The use of this format allows the Church to focus on the highlights of the life and ministry of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ in an organized and devotional way. With the rotating three year lectionary (the lessons we read in worship each week) we get to hear Jesus' story from the perspective of the different Gospel writers anew each year.

Beginning on the first Sunday in Advent the story of Jesus from the Gospel of Mark will be highlighted.

As a devotional tool for yourselves, let me invite you to set aside an hour one day in November and simply read the whole of Mark in one sitting. Better yet, do it a couple of times. As you read Mark, allow yourself to "forget" what you "know" from Matthew, Luke, and John and concentrate on just the story of Jesus from Mark's perspective. I have followed this discipline for a number of years and find it to be a wonderful tool for opening each Gospel's unique message to me. Mark, being the shortest of the Gospels, is a good one to start with.

Finally let me thank everyone for the warm welcome you have extended to both Sue and me as we have "dropped in" to help you through your transitional time. I particularly wish to thank everyone who voted for my pot of chili at the recent cook-off that allowed me to win the People's Choice award. I had a great time and am honored!




