A FOCUS ON MISSION AND MINISTRY AT GRACE

On Saturday, September 29, more than 100 volunteers from 7 Christian churches joined forces to respond to their neighbor's needs in a semi-annual event called "Love Your Neighbor Day". Twenty-three of those volunteers were from Grace! Some of us cleaned at Share and Care, some of us washed down walls, some mowed, raked and trimmed bushes. Others washed windows and still others painted walls and trim. The volunteers were rewarded with words of thanks such as, "Thank you. Everything smells so clean!" and "Here comes a band of angels direct from God!"

Love your Neighbor Day grew out of a discussion among a consortium of five Lutheran churches in Fremont (St. John's, St. Marks, Trinity, Faith and Grace) about how to respond to community needs. In the past couple of years we have been joined by Hayes Memorial United Methodist Church and the Church on 53.

Volunteers say that they are engaged in this work as a way of paying forward the blessings of God in their own lives. The next Love Your Neighbor Day is planned for April 27, 2013. Watch for more to come and plan to join in next spring as we love our neighbor.

Love Your Neighbor Day is an example of mission outside the walls of Grace. My Brother's Keeper is a ministry which strives to be a source of help and hope to the members of our church family.

On Sunday October 14, My Brother's Keeper held it's fourth annual fund raiser. In the past, it's been called the Chili Cook-off and Family Harvest Festival. This year we changed it up a bit and it was called The Soup Bowl and Family Harvest Festival.

That evening seventy-five to a hundred people came and sampled seventeen different kinds of soup made by members of our church family. At the end of the evening the winners were:

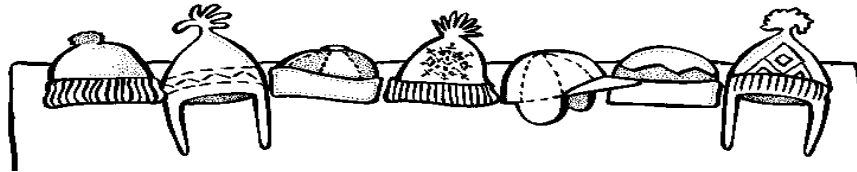

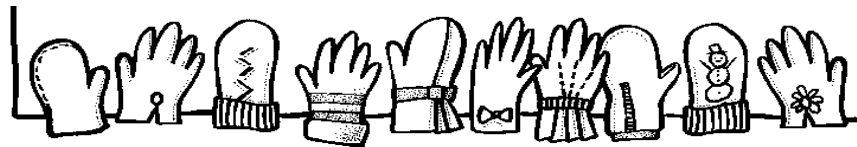

Well the season of Advent will soon be upon us. The Word Advent is from the Latin word adventus meaning "coming." It is a time of expectant waiting and preparation for the celebration of the Nativity of Jesus at Christmas. It is the beginning of our church liturgical year and commences on Advent Sunday.

This year on the first Sunday of Advent we will be giving every child an Advent calendar, a practice introduced by German Lutherans. Advent was always my favorite time of year. My sister and I would unpack all the Christmas decorations and decorate the entire house. The Advent calendar would sit on the dining room table. We would wait with anticipation as we opened each window during the week. So on Sunday, November 25th, we hope that many children will come forward during the Children's sermon and begin to learn about Advent. Another part of the Advent tradition in the Lutheran Church is the change of color for all the paraments, the cloths which hang from the pulpit and lectern. Many families have wonderful traditions during the season of Advent. I pray that you will be waiting and preparing to celebrate the Nativity of Jesus. Come and join the celebration!

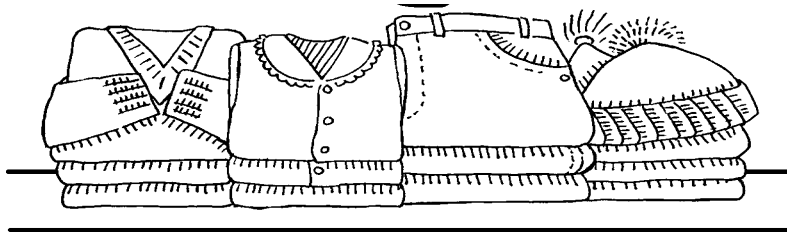

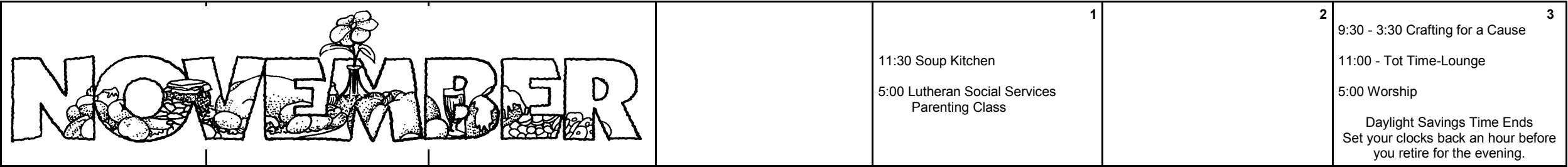
