Dear friends in Christ,
I am honored to be among you as one who serves. This is my first attempt at interim ministry, and I pray that all goes as well as this one has gone in the first month or so. It is my honor to be among such caring folks as you.

Part of the task of being an interim pastor is to observe congregational systems and let the leadership know of things in order to help prepare for a new permanent pastor. That sometimes conflicts with another mandate of being careful to change as few things as possible so a culture of incessant change does not permeate the congregation. When those two things conflict a helpful approach is to revert to the "default" setting. If any of you work with electronics at all even cell phones or personal computers you know that some settings come "built in" and those are the default settings.

Each hymnal of the Lutheran Church has had some inherent default settings. I have spoken to the worship committee of the council and we are going to return to those. What does that mean to all of you? It means for the 5:00 Saturday and 7:45 Sunday morning worshippers that we will be returning to having a confessional service each week. For the 10:00 Sunday crowd it means moving the confession back to its traditional place at the beginning of the service. In all cases then the order of worship will be the same at the beginning of the each service, each week. There will be Confession and Absolution, followed by the Gathering Hymn, the Apostolic Greeting, the Hymn of Praise, the Prayer of the Day and then the lessons. On Saturday, those will still come from the LBW, at 7:45 they will come from our license to use the ELW, and at 10 the praise team will still share their musical offering.

There are different models of worship practice within the Lutheran Church and few have had more variations than the use of the confessional service. At different times all the way back to Luther, we have looked at corporate confession in a variety of ways. The "school" from which I was trained and which perhaps reflects an older practice many of you grew up with says that we all approach God at the foot of
the cross in need of forgiveness. Upon being absolved of our sins we then worship God hearing His Word and sharing in His Sacraments. It is a mindset that we always approach God first as a supplicant, a sinner, in need of God's Grace.

This school of thought does not tie confession and absolution to the reception of Communion but instead to the act of worship. I am not sure one is "more right" than the other but perhaps the "default" we are returning to is the more traditional model. A third model which I will commend to your worship leadership for use perhaps in the Easter season is a celebration and remembrance of our Baptism as the opening rite. That model reminds us we approach God only because He has first washed us. All three models, and others, are valid though some express in action the words of our theology better.

There are lots of other things happening here. Catechism is being taught, Advent and Lent is being planned, the sick are being visited and all the rest of this congregation's varied ministries are ongoing. Thank you for allowing me to share them with you.
