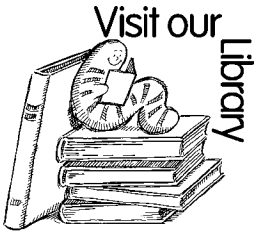

Requirements (both youth and chaperones):

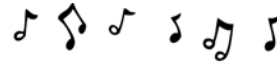
- \$100 non-refundable deposit due by October 5, 2011,
