CHRISTIAN MISSIONS/OUTREACH COMMITTEE

Will guide this congregation in sharing with others the gospel message of the good news of Jesus Christ. This committee will be responsible for missionary sponsorship and global partnerships. CHRISTIAN PROPERTY COMMITTEE

Shall be responsible for the maintenance and repair of all church property, provide for an adequate insurance program, and endeavor to anticipate major improvements and to propose necessary budgets for same.

CHRISTIAN WORSHIP COMMITTEE

Will oversee the congregation's ministry of Word and Sacrament in public worship, including volunteers for worship, music ministry, musical instruments, and whatever else is necessary for good worship in the congregation.

CHRISTIAN STEWARSHIP COMMITTEE

Will encourage the spiritual gifts of generosity and service in the congregation, by developing and carrying out a year-round stewardship ministry. This may include, but is not limited to, stewardship education and inspiration, an annual pledge campaign, any capital campaigns as authorized by Council, and encouragement of bequests and major gifts, the stewardship of the gifts of the people, managing the church membership list, and seeking to maintain current members for Christ and his church.




